**Chiaullee's** extended line-up at Celtic Connections 2010 went down a storm. Together with Greg Joughin, Jamie Smith, Malcolm Stitt and Rachel Hair, they presented a range of Manx, Celtic and original material. They played the Old Fruitmarket alongside Breton legends Pennou Skoulm, and also picked up a gig at the festival club. King Chiaullee were recorded for a radio station and Greg, Jamie and Malcolm were filmed for BBC Alba - all in all a highly successful trip.

King Chiaullee...was exactly what I expected and wanted. This is a young band to watch, and KZYX & Z listeners can expect to hear from this group. Their style ranges from straight traditional "Celtic" to a more Pan-European feel — all of it good. ... the band set everyone into a good mood. ... The finale, blending a powerful vocal from Joughin with a roaring instrumental from the full band, left the audience – including us – wanting more. (Oak & Thorn)

#### Bree Fiddle Workshop – Saturday 20th February 2010 Atholl Room, Peel Centenary Centre

At the end of Spring half term (Saturday 20th February, from 10am till 3.30pm), local fiddle player and teacher Katie Lawrence will be hosting the Bree Fiddle School in the Atholl Room at Peel Centenary Centre.

Open to secondary school age violinists, this one day workshop will focus on traditional playing techniques and ornamentation, and arranging and performance skills. Studying Manx folk tunes and Katie's own compositions and arrangements, the students will perform as a string ensemble for family and friends at the end of the day.

Katie is a primary school teacher who teaches fiddle, whistle and piano, and she has an MA in traditional music performance from the University of Limerick. She is a familiar face on the Manx music scene where she regularly performs with folk-rock band The Ballaghs, singer-songwriter Katherine Crowe, and as a duo with her equally talented sister Kirsty Lawrence.

The fiddle school will start at 10am and conclude with a short concert for family and friends at 3pm. The event is free of charge but students must register in advance and bring their own violin (i.e. fiddle!), music stand, packed lunch and refreshments for the day. Under 16s must bring written permission from parents/guardians if they need to leave the building during the day.

Now in its fourth year, Bree was established by the Manx Heritage Foundation as an umbrella group for young musicians, singers and dancers interested in Manx traditional culture. Open to ages 10 to 18, Bree meets each month for informal music sessions at Green's restaurant, regularly busks for local charities and holds educational workshop events throughout the year. 
