Manx band Skeel was delighted to receive another invitation from joint Scottish and Irish organisation, Colmcille to perform and teach at their annual festival. Held in the beautiful walled city of Derry, the festival featured top artists such as Skye's Anne Martin, Kerry's mighty Breandan Begley and Gaelic Psalm singers from Lewis. Skeel performed in an inter-Gaelic concert, taught adult workshops, appeared live on BBC Radio Foyle and visited Bunscoil Cholmcille, where they gave a mini performance and workshop.

Ca Canny

A taste of Ceol Mor (big music!) was brought to Manx children's ears last month as Scottish group Ca Canny opened school shows with the distinctive sound of the great highland bagpipes!



The tour was organised as a precursor to Yn Chruinnaght (details on front page) and the five students from the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama were brought over especially to perform in selected Island's schools. During their performances, the talented girls played a variety of instruments including highland and border pipes, whistle, flute, guitar, accordion, fiddle and bodhrán. Between the lively sets, they explained how their instruments work, performed songs in Scottish Gaelic, Scots and Doric, taught ceili dances and held a contest to spot the difference between jigs and reels. Amber the piper even led the children of Bride in a march around the playground! Practical workshops were also held for Share na Veg and Dhoon folk groups and for the combined secondary school folk groups and the five girls from RSAMD were very impressed by the wealth of talent in young Manx musicians.

The tour was organised by the Manx Heritage Foundation/Yn Chruinnaght and funded by the Isle of Man Department of Education.

Claire Mann confirmed for August workshops

As KMJ was going to press, details of the MHF Adult Traditional Music Summer School were confirmed. We're delighted to announce that fiddler, whistle and flute player extraordinaire, Claire Mann, will be the latest tutor for the Foundation's annual traditional music summer school for adults.



This year's workshops will take place over the weekend 23rd-24th August.

Claire comes from Newcastle upon Tyne and has established herself as one of the leading exponents of traditional Irish flute, fiddle and song. She has been performing since an early age and has won numerous All Ireland Championships on flute, whistle and fiddle. She currently teaches at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama in Glasgow and on the traditional music degree course at the University of Newcastle.

Claire has recently released the highly acclaimed album *Secret Orders* with singer, bouzouki player and guitarist Aaron Jones. Previous recordings include her self-titled solo album and duo *Tabache*. Fans will get a chance to hear her perform during the weekend summer school. More details on venues and times will follow in the August edition of KMJ.

Kiaull Manninagh - new CD release

June saw the release of a new CD of traditional Manx music called Kiaull Manninagh. Featuring well-known duo Bernard Osborne (violin) and Peter Lumb (guitar) this time joined by guru of the Celtic harp, Charles Guard, the CD makes a very attractive addition to your collection. With sixteen tracks of familiar Manx tunes – slow airs and more lively numbers alike – all beautifully arranged, Kiaull Manninagh is the perfection introduction to the Manx repertoire.



As well as being a well-known figure in classical and music education circles on the Island, Bernard played for the Manx Folk Dance Society for years and has contributed greatly to the revival of Manx culture through festivals like Yn Chruinnaght.

This CD is a re-issue of the 1992 cassette of the same name, with extra tracks recorded over the years, all remastered. The CD is supported by the Manx Heritage Foundation and is available throughout the Island for a very modest £10.99
